$$48 \div 2 \bigcirc 48 \div 4$$

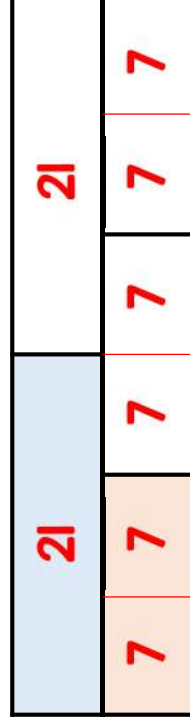
$$300 \times 2 \bigcirc 20 \times 30$$

2 There are 1,500 children in a school. 565 of the children are girls. How many more boys than girls are in the school? $1,500 - 565 = 935$
There are 370 more boys than girls.

3 Mr Patel writes a number on the board.

- Leon finds $\frac{1}{2}$ of the number.
- Sophie finds $\frac{1}{3}$ of the number.
- Leon's number is 7 more than Sophie's.

What is the number Mr Patel started with? This bar model may help you.
