

Literacy Activities Guidance

If you do not have access to a printer, your child should write each activity out on a blank page. Please keep these safe as they will be marked when school reopens. Butterflies- Look through the initial sounds powerpoint. Identify each animal on the slide before pressing the phoneme button to play the game. Can you match the sound to the first sound to the animal beginning with that sound?
