

WW2 Art Lesson – Piet Mondrian

This week we are going to have a look at a famous Dutch artist called Piet Mondrian. He is famous for abstract art and was creating these pieces of art around the time of WW2.

You will need a ruler and red, blue and yellow felt tips, crayons, colouring pencils or a mixture of them all.

If you prefer you can use a paint package on your computer to create a picture.

First of all you need to rule lines across and up and down your page using a pencil.

You can choose how wide or thin, close or far apart your lines are. The idea is to have lots of squares and rectangles.

When you are happy with your lines go over them in black.

Now it is time to colour in some of the boxes using the 4 colours – black, red, blue and yellow.
