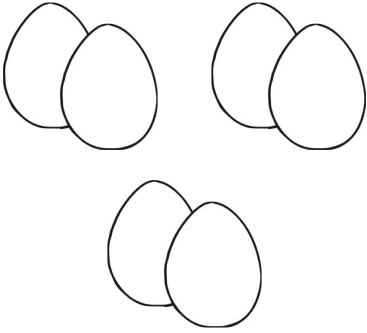
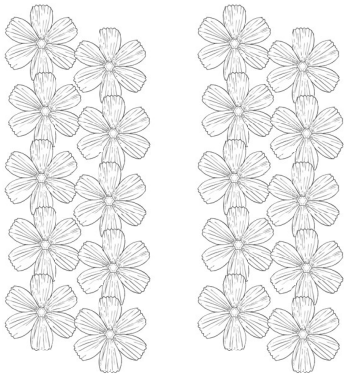


Spring Division by Grouping Answers

	There are 6 altogether. There are 3 groups. There are 2 in each group.	$\textcircled{6} \div \textcircled{3} = \textcircled{2}$ $\textcircled{2} \times \textcircled{3} = \textcircled{6}$
	There are 8 altogether. There are 4 groups. There are 2 in each group.	$\textcircled{8} \div \textcircled{4} = \textcircled{2}$ $\textcircled{2} \times \textcircled{4} = \textcircled{8}$
	There are 10 altogether. There are 2 groups. There are 5 in each group.	$\textcircled{10} \div \textcircled{2} = \textcircled{5}$ $\textcircled{5} \times \textcircled{2} = \textcircled{10}$
	There are 20 altogether. There are 2 groups. There are 10 in each group.	$\textcircled{20} \div \textcircled{2} = \textcircled{10}$ $\textcircled{10} \times \textcircled{2} = \textcircled{20}$
