

Week 7 Ladybirds



Hello boys and girls and kind helpers I hope you all had a restful holiday. Welcome to week 7 of our home learning schedule. This week we will be working on telling the time.

Here are some ideas to get you started;

Hints and tips for telling the time

- Draw attention to time. Mention the time at different points in the day. For example, you could say, ‘it’s 5 o’clock – time for tea,’ or ‘it’s 7 o’clock – time for a bath.’
- You could practise counting from 1–60 as this will make telling the time easier. Practising the five times table will also be a big help.
- Focus on telling the time to the hour and half hour on analogue clocks rather than digital clocks.
- If not already there, you could put a clock in your child’s bedroom. Ideally it should have a clear hour hand and half hour hand as this will help them to understand that the short hand shows the hour and the long hand shows the minutes.
- Talk about what you regularly do at different times in the day. Compare and contrast weekdays and weekends, if there are differences. Use time vocabulary such as today, yesterday, now, afterwards.
- Let your child remind you that it’s time to do something!

We have included a clock template in this week’s work schedule so that your child can start by making a clock face. You could talk about the hours in a day and minutes in an hour. We have also given you one PowerPoint to remind you of our TIME learning and what we have been doing in school.

The answers can be written on a page or a notebook. If your child forgets, remind them to write their name and the date on their page. We look forward to seeing the pictures of your work.
