Fractions and Decimals

$$\frac{1}{2} = 0.5$$

$$\frac{1}{4} = 0.25$$

$$\frac{3}{4} = 0.75$$

$$\frac{1}{10} = 0.1$$

$$\frac{1}{3} = 0.333\ldots$$

Square Numbers

$$1^2 = 1 \times 1 = \underline{1}$$

$$2^2 = 2 \times 2 = \underline{4}$$

$$3^2 = 3 \times 3 = \underline{9}$$

$$4^2 = 4 \times 4 = \underline{16}$$

$$5^2 = 5 \times 5 = \underline{25}$$

$$6^2 = 6 \times 6 = \underline{36}$$

$$7^2 = 7 \times 7 = \underline{49}$$

$$8^2 = 8 \times 8 = \underline{64}$$

$$9^2 = 9 \times 9 = \underline{81}$$

$$10^2 = 10 \times 10 = \underline{100}$$

Cube Numbers

$$1^3 = 1 \times 1 \times 1 = \underline{1}$$

$$2^3 = 2 \times 2 \times 2 = \underline{8}$$

$$3^3 = 3 \times 3 \times 3 = \underline{27}$$

$$4^3 = 4 \times 4 \times 4 = \underline{64}$$

$$5^3 = 5 \times 5 \times 5 = \underline{125}$$
